- More than 70% of Ghana's youths reside in the rural communities, with dilapidated, under-funded, under-resourced schools, and limited educational aspirations.
- The Aklowa Scholarship Project (ASP) aims to provide scholarships and much need school supplies to needy rural students in Ghana.
- It is our belief that the best education is the one a student receives in his own environment. But a student cannot learn effectively in the poverty-stricken, inhospitable and sometimes hostile environments in many rural schools in Ghana.
- We therefore aim to work with Canadian donors, African teachers, and parents to help Ghanaian students to provide modest scholarships to pay for students' school supplies, food, medical care, school transportation, registration and other fees.
